## **FOREWORD**

The life of Indonesian people is currently being hit by various problems. Starting from the problems of farmers living in rural areas to the problem experienced by the urban communities. In Nagari Sungai Tanang society in West Sumatra, the difficulty experienced by the farmers is poverty, this happens as a result of livelihood vulnerability to changes. Erwin discuss this issue in terms of changes in family life in West Sumatra and strategies needed to face that change. HIV/AIDS epidemic issues attract Yanuar Farida Wismayanti attention.
